Well, can't anyone see that? There is a person lying apparently unconscious on the floor at Berlin Central Station — and everyone is walking past, having ways explained to them. We see an everyday scene that may not seem very everyday. Don't worry, there really wasn't anyone lying there unconscious — and someone would have looked after the person. She has simply been collaged into the scene. It is the artist herself who is both explaining something to the traveller and at the same time lying on the ground behind her.

This motif may remind us of moments when something specific suddenly becomes more important, when it is about a person — and we are preoccupied

with other, perhaps secondary things. The exhibition has only used a subtle background light in a dominant colour in the picture.
