Triptych: "Three Faces of Transformation"

Not three women, but three states:

Wanting, hesitating, being.

Ännchen - the power over the other.

Agathe - the search for herself.

Emma Mia - Love without purpose.

The movement from left to right is not a moral ascent, but a return: to openness, to the body, to the smile of light.

Left Wing - Ännchen (the doer) (protagonist in C.- M. von Weber, Der Freischütz)

- In a Bregenz stage setting, slightly abstracted light shining on a constructed footbridge.
- Ännchen stands with her head slightly tilted, energetic, purposeful, but with a shadow across her chest.
- Her clothing is practical, modern, perhaps with a subtle historical quote (e.g. half a bodice).

- There is a sadness without direction in her gaze, but also an openness.

Right Wing – Emma Mia (Love) (protagonist in I. Lorenz, Why me? Why me not?)

- Radiant light, magenta dress, cocktail glass in hand not as an accessory, but as a
 poetic symbol:
 - "I've become the vessel."
- She is not looking head-on, but into the horizon perhaps she is smiling slightly.
- The sky opens up behind her not pathos, but peace.
- Around her, other figures in the approximate, which do not take over, but resonate with her.
- A hint of water in the background, a hint of depth and movement.
